- The FLSA case for secondary employment in Baltimore County Public Schools is in Federal Court and we are currently waiting for a trial date.
- The Blake case is set to move forward in Federal Court. We received the "Right to Sue" letter from the Department of Justice, and are moving forward with a motion to amend the suit for a permanent injunction and a claim for damages. Any additional discovery will be conducted by October when attorneys from both sides will meet with the judge to set a trial date.
- We are finalizing discussions with the Labor Commissioner over the Health and Safety Policy. Neither side has conceded their positions.
- We are waiting for a decision on the Siedlecki case. The case was argued in front of Judge Ballou-Watts on June 10, 2008.

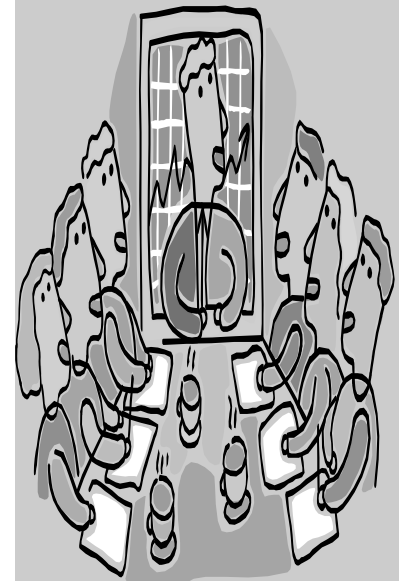
