NATIONAL FOP LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

National Blue Alert Legislation Introduced in Senate

Chuck Canterbury, National President of the Fraternal Order of Police, welcomed the introduction of S. 3972, the "National Blue Alert Act." The bill would help establish a "National Blue Alert" system for the local, regional and national dissemination of time-sensitive information to help identify a suspect in the event that a law enforcement officer is killed or seriously injured in the line of duty.

"Law enforcement officers are in harm's way each and every hour of their shift," Canterbury said. "This Blue Alert legislation provides law enforcement and the public with the tools needed for the expeditious apprehension of our most dangerous assailants—those who attack a law enforcement officer."

The legislation, introduced by Senators **Benjamin L. Cardin (D-MD)**, Patrick J. Leahy (D-VT), Lindsey O. Graham (R-SC), would mirror the existing "Amber Alert" system by using existing communications networks to immediately disseminate sensitive information to appropriate law enforcement and other public agencies when an officer goes missing, is severely injured or killed in the line of duty. Specifically, this bill would authorize \$5 million dollars through the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) in U.S. Department of Justice to encourage, enhance, and integrate "Blue Alert" plans through a system of training and support for State and local law enforcement units. For those States with such systems in place, an additional \$5 million is authorized to improve them with new technologies.

"This is about officer safety," Canterbury added, "We strongly support its passage and look forward to working with Senate leadership to pass the bill."

FOP Top Priority introduced in the Senate

Chuck Canterbury, National President of the Fraternal Order of Police, hailed the introduction of S.3944, the "**Law Enforcement Officers' Equity Act.**"

"Nearly 30,000 Federal law enforcement officers do not receive equal status with their Federal law enforcement colleagues under current pay and retirement laws of the government they so proudly serve," Canterbury said.

This legislation, introduced by **Senator Barbara Mikulski (D-MD)**, would provide these brave men and women with 6(c) benefits and the ability to retire after twenty (20) years of service at the age of fifty (50), or twenty-five (25) years of service at any age. This is the same benefit currently received by most criminal investigators and Federal law enforcement officers in several agencies. This legislation will also provide for savings in training costs, improve recruitment and retention of qualified officers, and enhance public safety.

"We strongly endorse the passage of this bill and applaud the efforts of Senator Mikulski on the important issue of Federal retirement," said Canterbury.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE

- On November 19, 2010 I attended a step #3 grievance hearing for two members who were grieving a denial of health benefits for their spouses. The grievants and their spouses are same sex couples who have been legally married in a state where same sex marriages are permitted. Both were originally given benefits under the recent open enrollment but later those benefits were revoked by County government officials when it was discovered the members' spouses were of the same sex.
- Maryland does have legislation that states only a man and a woman can be married in this state. But under Maryland common law, out of state marriages are recognized even if the marriage would not be legal in this state, unless the marriage is "expressly barred by the state" or the marriage is "socially repugnant." Case law in Maryland has set the "repugnant" level at a very high bar. An example of "repugnant" would be polygamy. The decision is pending.

LEGAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

- There have been no changes to the status of any pending suits against the County. The Smith Administration continued to appeal every decision to the next level.
- Members have continued to utilize the Estate Planning program. We have had nineteen members submit paid receipts to

the lodge for a reimbursement.

- The Baltimore County Police Memorial Fund is donating \$25,000 the National Police Museum. A banner will be displayed in the foyer of the new museum recognizing our donation.

Reminder for Retirees at Tax Time

The *Healthcare Enhancement for Local Public Safety (HELPS) Retirees Act* allows a deduction of up to \$3,000 annually for premiums for health care insurance. The federal law went into effect Jan. 1, 2007. The deduction is for the federal income tax return only. More information can be obtained from the Lodge 4 website in the Contracts & Legislation section. Also, IRS publications have information on the topic that refer to pensions of retired public safety officers.
