Arbitrator Rules in Same-Sex Benefits Grievance

On November 17, 2011 Arbitrator Lois Hochhauser issued a decision granting the grievances of Pfc. Margaret Selby and Pfc. Juanika Ballard. In the decision, she stated that "the recognition of same sex marriages legally entered into in another jurisdiction is not against the public policy of the state of Maryland. Article IV of the Maryland Constitution ensures that 'full faith and credit' will be given to the public acts, records and judicial proceedings of another state." She further stated, as to the term "spouse" in the Memorandum of Understanding, "parties are not required to negotiate every specific word, and it is reasonable for parties to use the commonly accepted meanings of words or phrases. Either party could have questioned how inclusive the word "spouse" should be but neither party did. It is unreasonable to penalize only one party when it acted from a reasonable perspective"

In her award, she ordered the County to:

- Provide spousal health benefits to the spouses of the grievants; and either reimburse them for expenses incurred that would have been provided had such coverage been available when the application process was completed or, if permitted, make such benefits retroactive to that date.
- Pay Juanika Ballard for any unpaid leave she incurred for which she would have been entitled pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding.
- Ensure the Grievants and their spouses are provided with all benefits as same spouses are entitled to receive pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding.

This arbitration decision should also settle an additional grievance that was filed on October 25, 2011 by Sgt. Marcy Schwartz. She requested and was denied family leave for her spouse on July 21, 2011. She also requested and was denied bereavement leave on October 20, 21 and 24, 2011 for the death of her spouse's grandmother.

The Healthcare Enhancement for Local Public Safety (HELPS) Retirees Act allows a deduction of up to \$3,000 annually for premiums for health care insurance. The federal law went into effect Jan. 1, 2007. The deduction is for the federal income tax return only. GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE ~Dave Rose~

- The Tabitha Weinstein grievance was heard November 8, 2011 at step #3. The hearing lasted approximately one hour. On November 14, 2011, the Administrative Law Judge agreed with Tabitha Weinstein and granted the grievance. In his decision, he stated "An employee on accident leave is supposed to be recovering from an injury or illness, not working." Officer Weinstein was granted credit for the 47 hours she worked while on accident leave.
- On September 27, 2011 the FOP filed a Class Action grievance for changes made to the Absence Control Policy. The position of the FOP is the policy is a working condition that is subject to bargaining and the unilateral changes County Executive Kamenetz made were in violation of the Employee Relations Act. The FOP has made several attempts to discuss the policy with the County Executive or his designee but they continue to decline.

- The Employee Relations Act case was heard on September 9, 2011 at the Court of Special Appeals. We are currently waiting for a decision.


PENSION COMMITTEE ~ Cole Weston ~
